### Annual Mission Co-op

Next weekend, *August 6-7, Fr. Jean-Baptiste Mubibi, CICM* (the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary), a *Missionhurst missionary*, will be visiting our parish to preach at all the Masses to present this year's annual mission co-op appeal. A second collection will be taken up at next weekend's Masses to support Missionhurst – CICM. Fr.
