On this the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday, we hear the parable of the "Prodigal Son" or it might be described as "a most loving and merciful Father." Those who are considered outcasts and sinners, the dregs of society, criticized by those who consider themselves right with God give Jesus the occasion for the parable. It is about two sons. One has squandered his inheritance and seems to come to his senses. The other is dutiful but questionable as to his motivation or love of his father and family. Perhaps we have heard it said there is within us both sons. As we mark the half way point of Lent, ask yourself, has the opportunity for grace and conversion been wasted or only done out of obligation, or some of both? Do you celebrate with God our Father as those around you come back to the Lord? Are you truly deepening in the life of Christ? Who in the parable do you most identify with...the father, the prodigal, or the dutiful brother?

> O God, Who through Your Word Reconcile the human race to Yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come. March 10, 2013 Fourth Sunday of Lent

"I no longer deserve to be called your son."

Luke 15:19



Sunday, March 10, 2013: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Look to him that you may be radiant with joy, and your faces may not blush with shame. (Psalm 34:6)

- There are three characters in today's parable, the younger son, the older son, and the father. Who do you most closely relate to?
- Have you always been forgiving to those who have hurt you?
- When you do forgive, are you able to reconcile and join in feasting with the one who hurt you or do you hold a grudge?

Why must we suffer?

God did not want men to suffer and die, in fact, God's original idea for man was paradise: life forever and peace between God and man. Man lost the original harmony with the world and ultimately with God. Sacred Scripture tells us that the experience of alienation is expressed in the story of the Fall. Because sin crept in, Adam and Eve had to leave paradise and their harmonious relationship with each other and God. The toil of work, suffering, mortality, and the temptation to sin are signs of this loss of paradise. St. John Chrysostom wrote, "We have lost paradise but have received heaven, and therefore the gain is greater than the loss." (Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church) (Youcat #66)

What about this "Guilt"...for which Catholics are mocked?

Guilt prepares a person for repentance. The insight into one's personal guilt produces a longing to better oneself; this is called contrition. We arrive at contrition when we see the contradiction between God's love and our sin. We are then full of sorrow for our sins, we resolve to change our life and place all our hope in God's help. St. Teresa of Calcutta wrote, "Some saints described themselves as terrible criminals because they saw God, they saw themselves, and they saw the difference." (From the Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church) (Youcat #229)
