Luke 23:1-49

“Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom.” Luke 23:42

- Peter had formed a bond with Jesus, was the chosen leader of his disciples, and yet denied knowing Jesus. There is a song that says “you always hurt the one you love”. Do you find yourself treating family members in a way different, in a less kindly way, than you would a stranger?
- Do you ever find yourself speaking to Christ as the one criminal did, demanding an action or response to a prayer in the manner you see fit?

At the same time, we make it our prayer that believers’ witness of life may grow in credibility. To rediscover the content of the faith that is professed, celebrated, lived and prayed, and to reflect on the act of faith, is a task that every believer must make his own, especially in the course of this Year. **Why is the “Last Supper”
so important to our Catholic Faith?**

Jesus showed his consummate love at the Last Supper. He instituted the Holy Eucharist, the focal point of our Faith, and symbolically anticipated his redeeming Passion by speaking these words over the gifts of bread and wine: “This is my body which is given for you.” He also made the Apostles priests (Holy Orders) when he commanded them to “Do this in remembrance of me.” Regarding the Last Supper, Pope Benedict XVI has said, “In a certain sense we can say the Last Supper itself is the act of foundation of the Church, because he gives himself and thus creates a new community, a community united in communion with himself.” (From the Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church) (Youcat #99)
