Bishop Richard Lennon is inviting everyone to attend a special noon Mass at the Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist on Independence Day - Wednesday, July 4. Consider reflecting on and discussing what “shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion” means. This phrase, known as the “Establishment Clause,” started out as a prohibition on Congress’ either establishing a national religion or interfering with the established religions of the states. It has since been interpreted to forbid state establishments of religion, to forbid governmental preference (at any level) of one religion over another, and to forbid direct government funding of religion.
