Laetare Sunday

This Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent marks the midway point of Lent. It is also called Laetare (which is Latin for "praise") Sunday. Like the blind man given sight in the Gospel for this weekend's Liturgy (John 9:1-41), may we begin to see more than wth our eyes. Pray we see more clearly the meaning of the Paschal Mystery (Christ's life, death and resurrection) in our life. Let us pray...

O God, who through your Word reconcile the human race to yourself in a wonderful way, grant, we pray, that with prompt devotion and eager faith the Christian people may hasten toward the solemn celebrations to come.
