On Holy Saturday Confessions are at 11:30am, Blessing of Easter Food at 1:30pm, Easter Vigil Mass at 9:00pm.

In today's gospel, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. When Lazarus came out of the tomb, Jesus instructed his family and friends to untie the bandages that bound him.
