From the Pastor's Desk

Our observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year. But Lent is much more. It is a time of conversion, grace, and new direction. What is the way? What are we to do? We are to pray. We are to fast. We are to share. We are to do more rather than to do less. Perhaps you could go to Mass during the week as well as on the weekend. Planning to go a fish fry on Fridays of Lent? Plan making the Way of the Cross on Fridays. Plan some time in the morning, midday, or in the evening to read the Scriptures. Pray the rosary with those you live with. Maybe pray a decade at the evening meal. The household (of one or many) could end the day by praying (after a few moments of reflection) an Act of Contrition, an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be. Reflect on how you could be less me-centered and more other centered? How can you share that others might have enough?
