For example, we served 36 clients in the furniture bank this month, a 60% increase over either July or August. Similarly, in the last three weeks we had about a 15% increase in the number of food clients. This just emphasizes that we need more volunteers to handle the increase in clients. October also saw the continuation of the blanket give away, and on the 29th we opened up the winter coat room. Thanks for all you do to continue this work.
