On this day in 1947, our Blessed Mother appeared to Sister Pierina in a little church in Montichiari, Italy and stated: "It is my wish that every year, on December 8th, at noon, the HOUR OF GRACE FOR THE WORLD be celebrated. Many divine and bodily graces will be received through this devotion..." Our time together will begin with Psalm 51 followed by silent communication with God, meditating on the Passion of Jesus, saying the Rosary, and giving praise and thanks to the Lord.*

Come and immerse yourself in the joy of the Advent Season on December 2, the First Sunday of Advent at this *Festival of Lessons and Carols* at Mother of Sorrows Church, 6034 South Locust Street, Peninsula, Ohio at 4:00pm. The Festival of Lessons and Carols is an Advent Tradition dating back to the late Nineteenth Century. Blending together Scripture readings, prayers, Christmas carols, and other religious music may prove to be a special grace. Despite the Fall of Adam and Eve, God's loving plan of salvation brought hope and is realized in the birth of Jesus, his life death and Resurrection. It does not end there. Jesus commissions his disciple to go out and immerse the world in every time and place to the joy and life that He brings.
