At Holy Family Parish Monday, November 5th *Humanae Vitae, Natural Family Planning* What They Mean for Catholic Families Today

Fr. Kevin Klonowski, Parochial Vicar, Holy Family Church, will discuss the 50th anniversary of *Humanae Vitae*, St. Pope Paul VI's landmark encyclical, during a presentation at 7 p.m., Monday, November 5, in the Lower Church Hall of Holy Family Church (3179 Kent Rd. in Stow). The program also will feature a presentation on Natural Family Planning by Leo and Toni Doty. In the free program, sponsored by Knights of Columbus Fr. Maruskin Council 10936, Fr. Klonowski will discuss St. Paul VI's 1968 encyclical, which reaffirmed the Catholic Church's longstanding position on the use of artificial birth control. Fr. Klonowski will cover the encyclical itself, the history behind it, its content, its theology, its lasting impact on the Church, and its application to the marriage covenant. Leo and Toni Doty will provide information about the benefits of Natural Family Planning and how it enhances the couple's relationship, the health consequences of artificial methods of birth control, and a brief look at what's involved in an NFP course. Leo and Toni are Diocesan-certified NFP instructors. They have been married 24 years and have practiced NFP 24 years. They have three children and have been Holy Family Parishioners 19 years. Following their presentations, Fr. Klonowski and the Dotys will conduct a question and answer session with audience members.
