Living Bread Radio Network presents  
two new programs for 2019

Canton, Ohio (12/27/2018) – The listeners of Living Bread Radio Network are getting the gift of two new programs starting on January 8, 2019. The exclusive program *The Storytellers* hosted by Tony Agnesi will air at 2:00 p.m. every Tuesday. The station will also become home to *Dare Great Things* hosted by Fr. Nathan Cromly, CSJ which will air Tuesdays at 2:30 p.m.

"We are excited for these great programs to join our lineup in 2019. Our goal has been to offer programming that is exclusive to our station and that enriches the life of every listener," said Barbara Gaskell, president of the Living Bread Radio Network.

*The Storytellers* will be hosted by Tony Agnesi, the senior vice-president of Rubber City Radio Group and author of *A Storytellers Guide to a Grace Filled Life*. The show will focus on a special guest that will discuss their story about their faith journey, struggles and successes. Listeners will hear both heartfelt and heartwarming stories.

"Tony is a wonderful storyteller and this show will showcase his talents. The show will bring listeners stories that they themselves have felt along their personal faith journey," said Gaskell

*Dare Great Things* is hosted by Fr. Nathan Cromly, CSJ, founder and president of Eagle Eye Ministries. Cromly will use the show to combine fresh spiritual insight with practical wisdom and poignant examples. The program promises to refresh, invigorate and inspire those who listen to dare great things for Christ as they engage the modern culture in their personal and professional lives.

"Fr. Cromly is a well-known and insightful voice that will enlighten many listeners through his program. We welcome into the Living Bread Radio Network family," said Gaskell.

The network was launched July 1, 2004 with AM 1060, broadcasting in Canton, Akron and Cleveland. Since then, the station has added 94.5 FM in Canton and 89.5 FM in Youngstown. These three stations reach more than two million souls in Northeast Ohio. The network is proud to offer authentic Catholic programming to Northeast Ohio and beyond. There is a free mobile app available for download on smartphone or tablet and a 24 hour streaming service online.

The Living Bread Radio Network is located inside the St. Raphael Center, Inc. at 4365 Fulton Dr. NW in Canton. The mission of the studio is to faithfully broadcast the message of Jesus Christ through the medium of radio.

Programming enlightens and educates listeners to the depth and richness of the Catholic Faith, encourages and inspires those already Catholic to learn more about the Faith and to pass on those teachings to their children. They foster and promote devotion to Mary, the Mother of Our Savior and our Mother. They support and defend the sanctity of every human life from conception until natural death. All programming and content are loyal to the teachings of the Magisterium of the Roman Catholic Church.
