Wednesday evening, March 20 for the annual diocesan-wide "Evening of Confession" at Mother of Sorrows and all churches in the diocese will have Confession from 5-8pm. There will be 2 confessors available. Come and encounter the experience God's loving mercy in the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. As our Holy Father, Pope Francis has reminded us, "God never tires of forgiving us." **This is an excellent Lenten practice as we prepare for Easter.**

As is custom, the Gospel proclaimed on the Second Sunday of Lent recalls the Transfiguration of our Lord on Mount Tabor. It is read forty days before Good Friday. The apostles, Peter, James and John are led up the mountain where they see Jesus in all His glory. They and we are reminded by God to listen to Him. They and we see the beloved Son suffer and die on Good Friday to conquer sin and death. The Son now lives in glory. The glory of eternal life He came to obtain for us that we begin to live in Baptism. Do we truly believe this? Are we listening? How is your Lenten journey bringing you to Easter this year? Let us pray...

Your word, that, with spiritual sight made pure,
we may rejoice to behold Your glory.
