Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord joins us with all the disciples of the Lord Jesus of every time and place. In the faith we share, we follow Our Lord as He enters Jerusalem to the Hosannas of the people. We share in the Gospel account of the Passion of the Lord. Day by day we follow our Lord. On Holy Thursday we reaffirm the call to service. the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Priesthood. Good Friday brings us to walk with Jesus on the road to Calvary. Consider keeping the Good Friday fast until the Easter Vigil. Pray that together as we share in this holy time, we may all experience the special grace of God's mercy and peace as never before.
