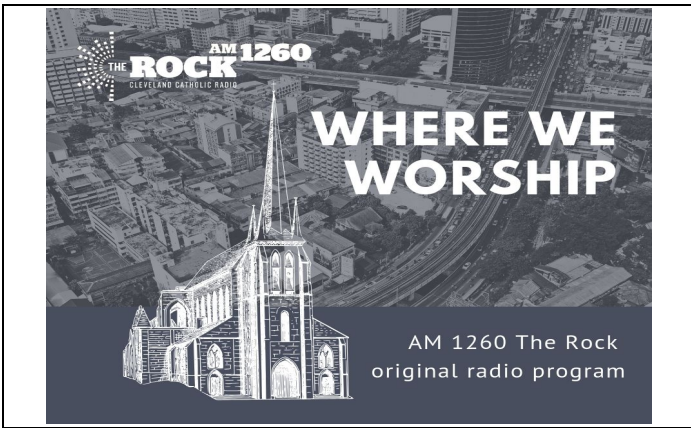
In Your Charity

Women’s Board of CCC/SC

The Women’s Board of CCC/SC promotes the programs of Catholic Charities Corporation of Summit County through volunteer service and fundraising events. There are currently 51 members. The members are from many different parishes throughout Summit County. Meetings are held once a month from September through May. Each year the Board has two major events. The first is the Christmas “bags of love” program in which members adopt families selected by Catholic Charities. Last year 30 families received “bags of love” filled with personal gifts, cleaning products and toiletries. And second, a fundraising luncheon/auction is held every March. With the proceeds from the 2019 fundraiser, the Women’s Board gave \$16,500 to Catholic Charities of Summit County; \$11,000 for counseling, \$4,500 for Camp Christopher Camperships, and \$1,000 for the Hot Meals program. The next meeting of the Women’s Board will be at Blessed Trinity Church, 300 E Tallmadge Ave in Akron on Friday September 13 at 9:30. We welcome guests and new members!
