Eagle Scout Ranking

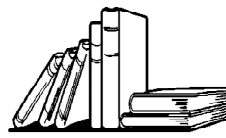

From the Pastor's Desk

Our observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 13 February 2013, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year. But Lent is much more. It is a time of conversion, grace, and new direction. What is the way? What are we to do? ***We are to pray. We are to fast. We are to share. We are to do more rather than to do less.*** Perhaps you could go to Mass during the week as well as on the weekend. Planning to go a fish fry on Fridays of Lent? Plan making the ***Way of the Cross*** on Fridays. Plan some time in the morning, midday, or in the evening to read the Scriptures. Pray the rosary with those you live with. Maybe pray a decade at the evening meal. The household (of one or many) could end the day by praying (after a few moments of reflection) an act of contrition, an ***Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be.*** Reflect on how you could be less me-centered and more other centered? How can you share that others might have enough?

***Keep Your family safe, O Lord, with unfailing care,
That, relying solely on the hope of Heavenly grace,
They may be defended always by Your protection.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,
Who lives and reigns with You in the unity
Of the Holy Spirit,
One God, for ever and ever.

Sunday, February 10, 2013: Luke 5:1-11

When I called, you answered me; you built up strength within me. (Ps. 138)

- As we enter the Lenten season on Ash Wednesday, where are you in need of conversion or change in your life? How long has it been since you celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation?
- Just as Jesus called Peter and the other disciples, he calls us to be his disciples today – what changes do you need to make to follow him more closely?
- Who in your life – at home, at work, in your neighborhood – might be in need of your support? What keeps you from reaching out to share the Good News with them?

Who instituted the Sacrament of Penance (Confession)?

Jesus himself instituted the sacrament of Penance when he showed himself to his apostles on Easter day and commanded them, "Receive the Holy Spirit, If you forgive sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." St. Gregory Nazianzen said, "Penance is the second Baptism, the baptism of tears." The parable of the prodigal son best expresses Penance. Upon returning the son says he is no longer worthy to be called the father's son, but the father calls for the best robe, ring, and shoes since his son has returned.
