

Lazo

A *lazo* is a double rosary placed over the bride and groom during their wedding. A description of the words and actions can be found in the *Ritual del Matrimonio*, authorized by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for use in Spanish-language ceremonies. The placement of the *lazo* is optional, but permissible.

The priest blesses the *lazo* as a symbol of the couple's unbreakable union, established with the help of God. Deacons may witness marriages outside of Mass; although the ritual only mentions the priest, a deacon who presides at a wedding would logically bless a *lazo*. Then family members or friends of the couple place it over the shoulders of the groom and bride.

When does this happen? Customs vary, but the ritual suggests that it occur after the eucharistic prayer and before the Lord's Prayer. In this way, the couple receives the nuptial blessing while wearing the *lazo*. The ritual does not say when to remove the *lazo*, but logically the same people who placed it over the couple's shoulders would remove it after the nuptial blessing. That would free the couple to share the sign of peace and communion.

The words of the blessing suggest that the *lazo* symbolizes unity and commitment. Its continuous double loop implies the eternal nature of the commitment that this bride and groom now make. The nature of the *lazo* — a double rosary — suggests that the couple's commitment will be strengthened not only by God but also by their devotion to Mary and to prayer. The traditional nature of the ceremony implies that the couple is respecting the long sequence of marriages that led to their own. In this way, they ritualize the divine help on which they rely for a strong and happy marriage.
