

Listen to the story of a young man named Adam:

My story of war began when soldiers burned down my village in Darfur. My two younger sisters, four and six years of age, died in the fire. I was forced to enlist with the rebels, and my brother with government forces. Two months later, I found myself in the middle of a conflict with a rifle in my hand.

Adam wrote about this terrible suffering in a letter to Pope Francis. The Pope, as you can see in the picture above, came to visit refugees like Adam who escaped to Italy. Refugees are people who have to run away from their homes, even their country, to escape from violence or other disasters.

Adam is a refugee who ran away from a war in his country and risked a dangerous journey to Italy, where he hoped he would be safe. Sadly, when refugees arrive in what they think will be a safer country, they often feel rejected and find it difficult to survive. Adam says, "Many of us living in Italy don't have a bed, a hot meal or a place to call home where we can recover from our long journey and the horrors of war." Thankfully, Adam found the help and protection he needed with Jesuit Refugee Services in Italy.

Pope Francis asks you to pray for refugees this month. Your prayers can give hope to people like Adam and inspire countries' leaders to take good care of refugees.

Let's pray together: Dear Jesus, you were once a refugee. As a little boy, you had to run away from danger to Egypt. Please draw close to refugees in our world today. And thank you, Jesus, for sending helpers to take care of people who have to run away from danger.
