There is Hope

October is “**AWARENESS MONTH**” in the Catholic Charities’ Heroin/Opioid Awareness Campaign. When addiction dominates a family, knowing where to seek help can seem elusive. This Fall awareness campaign’s monthly focus features bulletin blurbs and social media posts on how to break the silence, raise awareness of where to turn for help, and how communities can decrease opioid availability. Look for Catholic Charities supported panel forums near your parish in October.
