This nine-week effort will include prayer and fasting for the intention that this change in the membership of the Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life. The Novena will also include materials to help educate the public about how *Roe v. Wade* is not health care, is bad law, and fails women.

The Novena began Friday, August 3<sup>rd</sup> and will continue to Friday, September 28.
