Parish Faith Formation For All Ages

Bible Study. Since our Bible Study will be taking a break for the summer, here is part of a reflection provided by Greg Sunter and liturgyhelp.com. "There is a lovely distinction in this gospel passage between disciples and apostles. Jesus calls his twelve disciples, commissions them and sends them out to continue his work. From then on, they are referred to as "apostles." Disciples are followers, but apostles have been sent out. In our own lives we are called to accept the challenge of being apostles, not disciples. For we are not just followers, we have been sent out by Jesus to continue his work. To be a disciple is just the first step. Disciples follow a path; apostles take the initiative and forge their own path."

Becoming Catholic – RCIA. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process for any adult who wishes to become a full member of the Catholic Church. The process covers many different life situations. Perhaps you are a baptized Christian who is considering becoming Catholic and would like more information about Catholicism. Maybe you were baptized in the Catholic faith but never received the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. Perhaps you have a child, 7-17 years of age who has not been baptized. If any of these describe yourself or someone you know, we are here to help you. There are a few updates on all of these items from last weekend:

Saint Victor Altar Server News: I've been following up with our Altar Server families to remind them of the importance of using our hybrid sign-up system, which works pretty well when it is utilized. The best way to sign up is in advance, using the sign-up binders. Karen uses those lists to produce the weekly Ministry List that is posted in the narthex. As a backup, there is a second way to sign up if there are any blanks on the Ministry List. If there is a blank on the Ministry List, please sign up and serve. Be sure to write your name on the Ministry List. Please be careful not to bump a server who is already scheduled. We need all our servers, and I am very happy that we have so many new ones!

Saint Victor Music News: As I am writing this letter on Monday morning, June 12, we have received about \$23,405.00 in direct contributions for the new piano. Wow! What an amazingly generous parish! Many thanks to everyone who has already contributed to the purchase of our new Yamaha Model "G" Artist Grand Piano, which was just below the \$25,000.00 threshold requiring diocesan permission. We do have an experienced Catholic Director of Liturgical Music lined up, and we plan to hit the ground running on September 1 with a rebooted program which will include choir for Christmas 2023 and Triduum 2024.

Parish School of Religion for Both Parishes: Sunday mornings have been pretty quiet since PSR wrapped up for the year. Visiting Revere Middle School is my favorite part of the week! Please keep in mind that Darlene Bednarz has quite a bit of planning to do in order to prepare for the 2023-2024 season, including purchasing materials. Sign-up packets are available in the vestibule at Mother of Sorrows and the Gathering Room at Saint Victor.

"HOLD" on Contributions of Clothing: I recently noticed some bags of clothing in the donation box. Clothing is not needed this summer. As we received from our Saint Vincent de Paul Chapter: "Please hold on to your gently used and new clothing until September or donate to the charity of your choice. Our Saint Vincent de Paul Chapter is not able to accept any clothing until Fall. Please do not put clothing in the box. Instead, we will be collecting paper products and soap products for local families in need. Watch for signs. As always, thanks for your generosity and support."

Catholic Social Teaching. The bishops and eparchs of the State of Ohio are urging all Catholics, including the Byzantine and other Eastern Catholic eparchies, to carefully prepare for upcoming elections by reviewing the four main pillars of Catholic Social Teaching, which are: The Sanctity of Human Life, The Common Good, Solidarity, and Subsidiarity. Please note, there is a Special Election on August 8th for an issue that is intended to raise the percentage of votes necessary to pass a state constitutional amendment. The bishops and eparchs of Ohio do not have a recommendation on that issue either way.
