

"The message to not be afraid is as much for the original intended audience of the gospel as it was for the apostles. The passage reminds them to have courage and to have the courage of their convictions; to shout from the housetops their message, not whisper it in darkness. We are called to continue the spread of the gospel message; continuing the work of those early Christian communities, the Twelve and Jesus himself."
