Dear People of God,

Father Faustine Furaha recently visited Mother of Sorrows and Saint Victor for the annual Missionary Cooperative Appeal. It was obvious that his message was well received, because our parishioners were very responsive to his message.

I found it very interesting that our representative this year was from Tanzania, because for many years I have been involved in an effort that assists the missionary effort in that area. The National Association of Priest Pilots (NAPP), of which I am an officer, has supported the ministry of Father Pat Patten, CSSp, who has spent twenty years as a bush pilot in Tanzania, the only Spiritan and only priest of four Flying Medical Service volunteers. They provide regular preventive, curative, and emergency health care and health education in areas far removed from ordinary medical facilities.

The NAPP has two functions, as I see it. It's a great opportunity to get together with priests from all over the country every year who have a common interest in aviation. But we also help raise funds for priests around the world who use aviation in the act of ministry. That is how I first met Pat Patten.

I once inquired if our diocesan mission in El Salvador would benefit from a priest pilot. The answer was, "yes!" But the problem was not with having a priest pilot, it was finding safe airplanes and people who could appropriately maintain them. The NAPP already has had one priest pilot who was involved in a fatal crash due to sabotage, and that is still a problem in some areas of the world.

Many years ago I received a phone call from the bishop of the poor, missionary Diocese of Baker in Eastern Oregon. He was very gracious. He said that he knew that I was a priest pilot, and asked if I would be willing to come to his diocese and serve as a missionary priest pilot. I asked him, "Well, have you asked Bishop Pilla (who was then the Bishop of Cleveland) about that?" He replied, "No, not yet." I responded, "Well, maybe talk to him first, and then we can continue this conversation." I never heard back from the Bishop of Baker!

The NAPP will be having its annual convention in the Pokonos. Why would a group of priests gather in what was once the honeymoon capital of the United States? The answer is, the Pokonos aren't really what they once were, and we found a fairly low-cost all-inclusive resort for our convention. I will be leaving early on Saturday morning, September 16 and returning on Friday, September 22. There will be a visiting presider on September 16 and 17.

The Pokonos are about two hours from Hyde Park, New York, where the Culinary Institute of America is located. That property was once a Jesuit novitiate, and the old Jesuit cemetery is still there. There is located the burial place of Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, one of the most important Catholic theologians of the Twentieth Century. Teilhard was formative for me, when I started reading him as early as eighth grade. Among other things, Teilhard was a discoverer of Peking Man in the late 1920's. His work, "The Phenomenon of Man" is a monumental work that inspired the anthropology and ecclesiology of the Second Vatican Council. I plan to visit his grave and offer a remembrance on behalf of myself and our two parishes.


