

Sacramental Preparation. While things were a bit different during the COVID season, at home and online classes were always available. Classes have been resumed last year and this year. October is Right to Life Month. This year Saint Vincent de Paul will donate a crib which will be set up in Saint Victor's Gathering Room during the month of October. Services provided include the delivery of furniture, food, clothing and advocacy. This center provides help to anyone in need of their services including babies and young mothers. 

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Our social justice responsibilities are founded on the precept of the dignity of the human person from which its companion principles of the common good, solidarity, and subsidiarity are derived. Every human person is endowed from the absolute beginning of life with an essential dignity that is inherent in their being divinely created, and cannot be denied, expunged, or mitigated in any way by any human authority.

The ultimate existential worth of every person is not contingent upon their station along the lifespan, in fact, classic moral teaching holds that the more vulnerable and defenseless a person is, the more compelling our responsibility for providing them protection and care. This is why the bishops and eparchs of the State of Ohio forthrightly oppose the citizen initiative that will elevate to a constitutional right the currently relaxed regulation of elective abortion choice in our state.

It is indeed true that a person's conscience enjoys a primacy of authority for each individual, but to be executed authentically this faculty must be carefully formed. Therefore the example and wisdom of our religious leaders provide a most valuable and indispensable source of guidance as we determine our resolution of complex ethical dilemmas, including those posed during election season.

Thus, please join me in carefully reviewing our understanding of the unique nature of the human person and its grounding in the act of creation, which we see as the first element of divine revelation. This will assist us in studying not only the temporal facts but also the existential realities that should guide all of our moral decisions. Faithful Catholics will place great weight on the guidance of those who are their primary leaders and teachers. More information on this topic has been provided by the Catholic Conference of Ohio, which speaks for all of the bishops and eparchs of Ohio collectively concerning social justice concerns.
