**Mother of Sorrows News:** Thanks to Jan and Rick Slenn along with Bill Reimer who have now pressure washed the garage in addition to the rectory. We are also currently planning an extensive commercial cleaning of the rectory resident building. Once again, I would like to commend Molly for her excellent service as MoS housekeeper. The needs at this time are far beyond the expectations of Molly's job description.

**Saint Victor News:** As previously related, the First Sunday of Advent, to be celebrated on December 2 and 3, is the perfect time to fine tune some liturgical practices which were relaxed during the height of the pandemic.

First, the Offertory Procession, which is already ongoing at Mother of Sorrows, is returning. This is when parishioners carry forth the gifts of money, bread and wine to the altar. It really is a significant gesture, as it represents the many gifts we bring when we gather together for the Eucharist, including the gift of ourselves.

Do you remember one of the most important things we can bring to the celebration of the Eucharist? It is: "The Willingness to Change and Be Changed." Some people might remember this as one of my five ideas.

Second, we can return to the former plans for Eucharistic Ministers approaching the altar a bit earlier, as the "Sign of Peace" is winding down. Beginning on December 2 Eucharistic Ministers are asked to enter the sanctuary as they utilize the hidden sanitizer dispensers and make use of them. Hopefully they will get to their places by the time the "Fraction Rite" during which the "Lamb of God" is sung comes to an end.

I'm not sure we are ready to return to the sharing of the Communion Cup yet. We can discuss that further and maybe consider this beginning in Lent. I'd welcome email comments regarding this matter.

**For Both Parishes:** Many of the sacrifices being made in support of the parishes are coming by way of **www.faithdirect.com**, using the parish code **"OH1017."** This is an outstanding way to support the parishes. General Funds are supported by the Sunday Offertory, Christmas, Easter and Holy Day collections. The two parish Building Funds are separate and are used for the maintenance and repair of buildings, grounds and other such costs. Building Funds remain 100% at parishes and are not subject to the 16.5% diocesan assessment.
